TIJUANA'S PARALLEL GRAVITY LINE PIPE REPAIR COMPLETE

The Mexican Section of the International Boundary and Water Commission reports that emergency repairs to the Tijuana Parallel Gravity Line are complete and all pump stations are operating at full capacity.

Following the restart of Mexico's sanitation system pumps, flows in the Tijuana River and canyon collector system have significantly decreased.

The South Bay International Wastewater Treatment Plant continues to capture and treat flows and is returning to normal operations, treating up to 35 million gallons per day.

While river flows have declined, odors may persist in the near term.

The U.S. Section of the International Boundary and Water Commission remains committed to effectively managing transboundary flows and addressing wastewater from Mexico at or near the source to the maximum extent possible to protect American communities from cross-border sewage impacts.
